
Access Land - Kingstone Down

Welcome to Kingstone Down. The shaded area on the map is 'Open Access' where you are free to walk anywhere. Why not spend some time absorbing the atmosphere? This site is a County Wildlife Site, of particular importance for its extensive banks of tor grass dominated chalk grassland and associated flora – as well as the Sarsen stones The land is farmed to encourage this diversity -so please control your dog and please do not drop litter.



Limits of access land --- Public rights of way * Access point (gate, kissing gate or stile)

Countryside Code

- Be safe plan ahead and follow any signs
- Leave gates and property as you find them

Local Information

- Dogs to be kept on lead when livestock are grazing and during the bird nesting season (April to August)
- Please ensure gates are closed and latched shut
- You cannot cycle, ride a horse, ride a motorcycle
