The first Baptist congregation was established in London in 1612. Congregations were independent and divided into different groups or sects, uniting in 1891.

The records consist of registers of baptisms, marriages and burials, minutes of meetings, accounts and other financial records, registers of members, Sunday school records, magazines, and historical notes.

Some of the baptism, marriage and burial have been transcribed and are available on the open shelves or on the computers in our searchroom.

Where to find these records

These records are held at the Oxfordshire History Centre. They date mainly from the 19th and 20th centuries

For other Baptist records and information about Baptist history there is The <u>Angus Library</u> at Regents Park College, Oxford. This is a national library and archive for Baptist and other nonconformist history.
