- To establish whether the road onto which the new/amended access will lead is classified or unclassified you can use our <u>interactive highway register</u> or contact our Customer service Centre on 0345 310 1111.
- 4. Oxfordshire County Council as a Highway Authority may grant authorisation from a highway point of view for construction of an access on land which forms part of the public highway. However, you are strongly advised to check the position of the highway boundary to ensure there is no intervening land.
- 5. We aim to process your application within one calendar month and will then contact you to confirm our decision.
- 6. Your attention is drawn to the requirement of any person carrying out works on the public highway to hold public liability insurance with cover to the value of £10,000,000 and to hold the Street Works Qualification under the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991.
- 7. Please note that some of the information contained on this form might have to be disclosed if it is requested as part of a Freedom of Information request.
