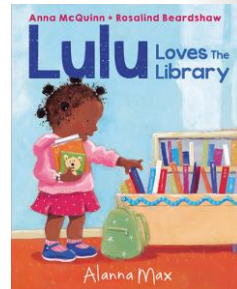
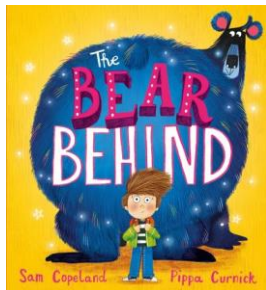
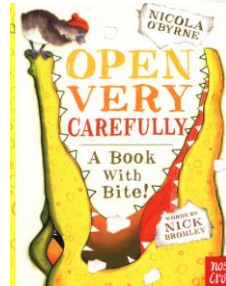
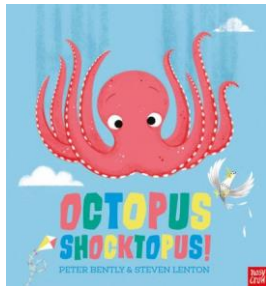
Sharing books with your child is enjoyable and can help them be ready for school.

Bill Martin & Eric Carle - Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What do you see?

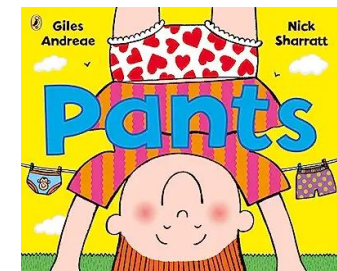
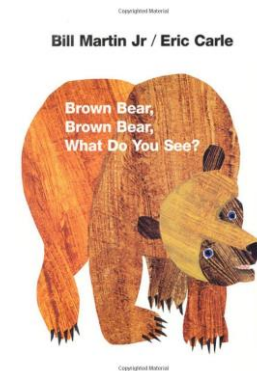
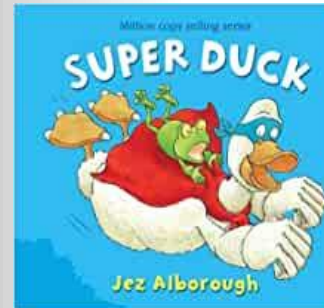
A big happy frog, a plump purple cat, a handsome blue horse, and a soft yellow duck--all parade across the pages of this delightful book.

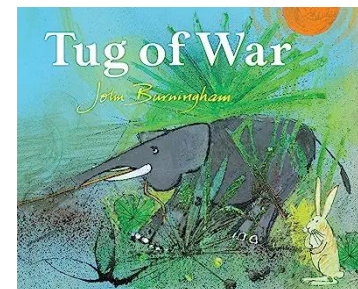
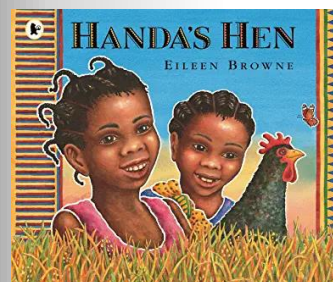
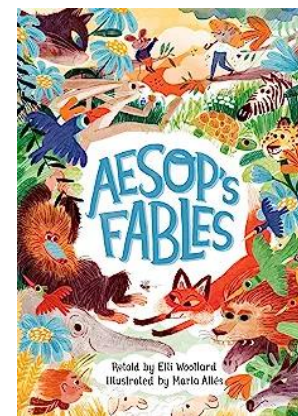
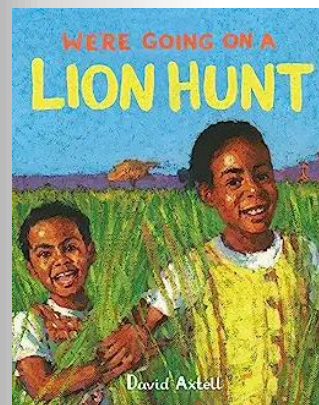
A beautifully illustrated and rhyming retelling of a selection of Aesop's Fables

Jeanne Willis - The cow tripped over the moon and other nursery rhyme emergencies

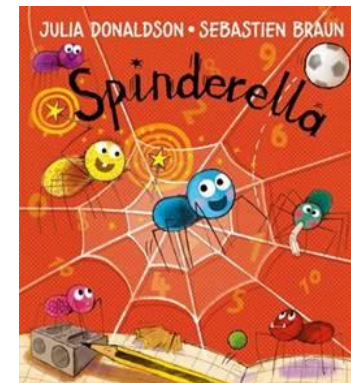
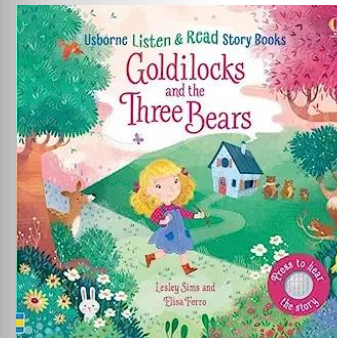
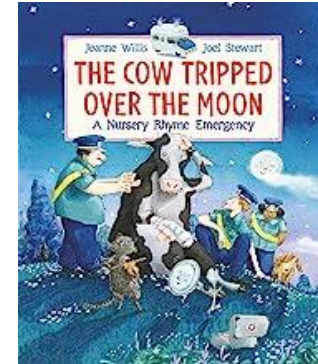
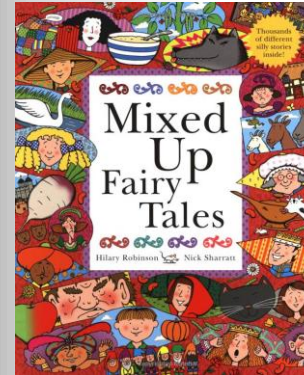
A rollicking twist on classic nursery rhymes.

Martha in the middle – Jan Fearnley

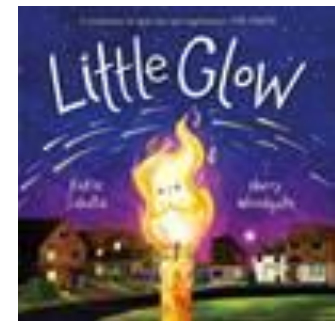
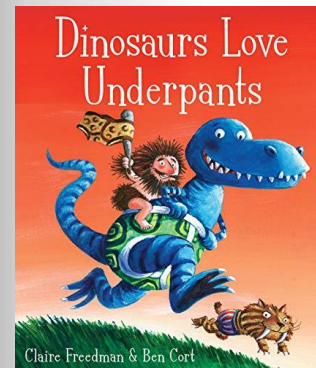
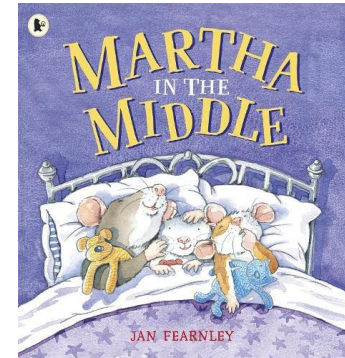
A charming story that helps explain how everyone in a family has their own important role to play.

Ken Wilson-Max - Lenny and Wilbur

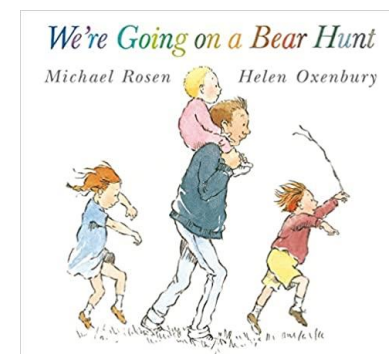
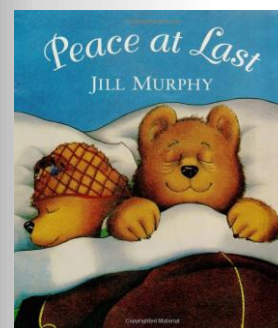
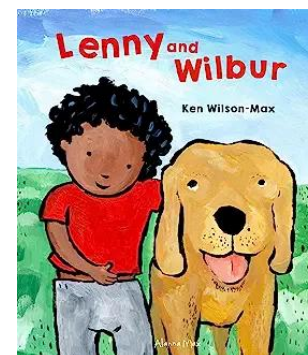
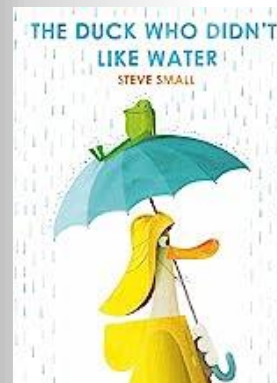
Bright, bold and reflective of a culturally diverse family, the illustrations exude warmth and fun.

Pamela Duncan Edwards - Dinosaur starts school

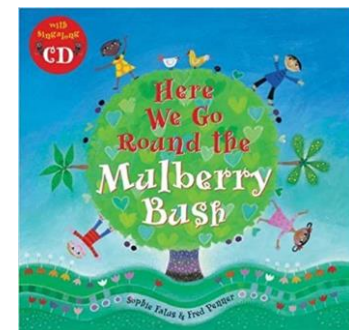
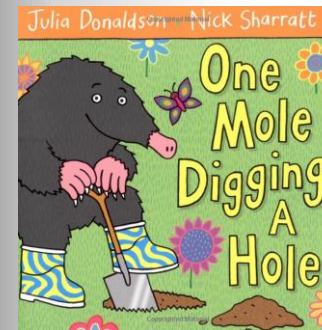
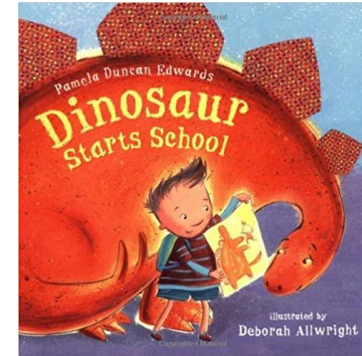
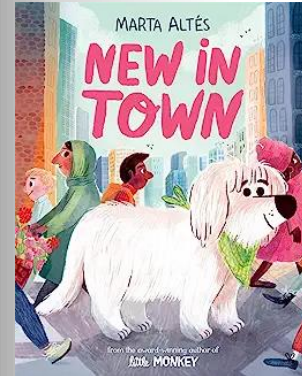
Dinosaur is worried about starting school but, with a little help from his friends, finds out that school is great.

Sue Graves - Little Tiger starts school

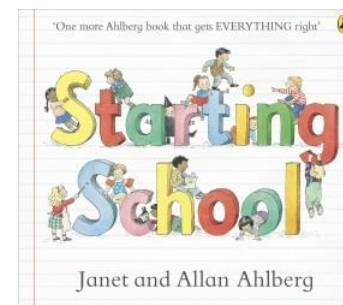
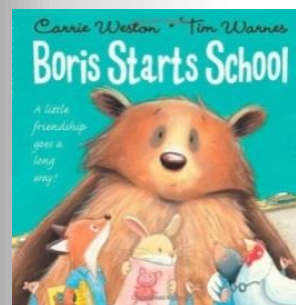
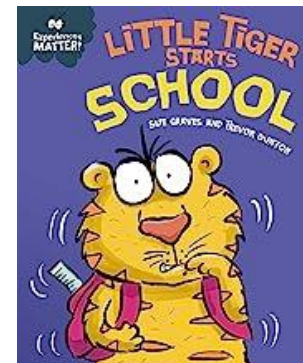
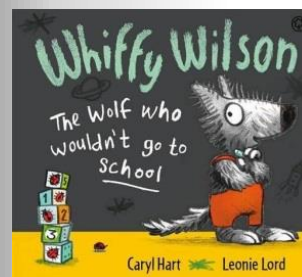
This funny, charming story is the perfect way to introduce young children to the experience of starting school
